#### Christianity (God)

- Sacred text is the Bible
- Place of worship is Church
- •Christains worship God
- Christianity is a monotheistic religion
- Christianity is the world's biggest religion (approx 2.1 billion followers)

### <u>Islam</u>

- Sacred text is Qur'an
- Place of worship Mosque
- Muslims worship Allah
- Islam is an Abrahamic, monotheistic, and universal religion teaching that Muhammad is a messenger of God

## Sikh Dharma

- Sacred text is the Guru Granth Sahib
- •Place of worship is Gurdwara
- •Sikhs worship Waheguru
- •Sikhism is a 500 year old religion and it is originated in India

Zakat	A form of almsgiving to the Muslim Umma
Role Model	A person looked to by others as an example to be imitated
Leader	A person who leads or commands a group

Prophet	A person regarded as an inspired teacher or proclaimer of the will of God
Abrahamic Faith	A group of mostly monotheistic religions that endorse worship of the God of Abraham
Old Testament	A group of mostly monotheistic religions that endorse worship of the God of Abraham
Guru Granth Sahib	Is the central holy religious scripture of Sikhism
Equality	The state of being equal, especially in status, rights, or opportunities
Kirtanwara	A genre of religious performance arts
Scripture	The sacred writings of Christianity contained in the Bible
Commitment	the state or quality of being dedicated to a cause
Baisakhi / Vaisakhi	is the festival which celebrates the founding of the Sikh community,
Chauri	a whisk that is waved over the Guru Granth Sahib (the Sikh holy book) whenever it is rea
Guru	A term for a "mentor, guide, expert, or master" of certain knowledge or field
